Farewell Greeting as the President of ACF

My fellow ACF members. I hope all has been well with you. It has been 2 years since I have held the position as president of ACF. Time seems to go by very quickly. The past events of ACF are hereby described as follows. In the summer of 2002, the Asian Concrete Forum was founded in Sapporo, Japan and in the winter of 2004, after 3 years, the Asian Concrete Federation was founded in Chiangmai, Thailand. From 2005 to 2006 Japanese Professor Uomoto held the first presidency and during his presidency, from 2007 to 2008, laid the foundation of ACF. From 2009 to 2010, as I held the 3rd presidency of ACF, landmark conferences of this prominent association continue to be held.

Reflecting on the past achievements of ACF in early 2009, I spent a great deal of time transferring the executive office from Japan to Korea. In addition, it took a great deal of time to establish a corporation for a bank account. Finally, in the summer of 2009 a new bank account was fortunately

established, and a sum of \$35,000 was gratefully transferred from Japan. Afterwards, a significant amount of time was also spent establishing a homepage server which was transferred from Japan. Unfortunately, context which was in Japanese had to be translated into Korean and the struggle with the Japanese domain ombudsman was not easy. Eventually, the ACF homepage of the URL www.acg-org.com was discontinued and it had to be changed to www. acf-org.net. This predicament created a weak financial circumstance for ACF. I greatly apologize for any distress this has caused to ACF members.

I would also like to reflect on the important accomplishments of ACF over the past 2 years. In March 2009, working with the US ACI, I attended the ACI spring convention in San Antonio, Texas where I interviewed ACI ExCom members. As a result of this meeting, I managed and hosted the ACF-ACI interrelated International Partnership Program (IPP). In April 2009, with the thankful aid of Vice-Chairman Dr. Hung, a President and Vice-Presidents meeting was established in Hanoi, Vietnam. Then, in 2009 September, with the aid of treasurer Dr. Limsuwan, the IABSE Conference was held in Bangkok, Thailand, and the "ACF Promotion Session" was attended by approximately 400 members. In the evening of the IABSE Conference, a meeting of the President and Vice-presidents was held. In December 2009, I headed the conference chair of the colloquium of the APFIS 2009 Conference and the ACF EC Meeting was hosted in Seoul. In June 2010, with the thankful aid of Vice-chairman Japanese Professor Ueda, a President and Vice President Meeting was established in Sapporo. The

contents of this conference is enclosed in the newsletter which was sent to all ACF members.

Earnestly, I have taken great measures to expand and include additional members of ACF RM. With the aid of the Vice-chairman, I have contacted the U.S., Australia, Mongolia, Egypt, Russia, New Zealand, Cambodia, and Laos. With the exception of contacting the US ACI IIP, I could not include any additional countries into our membership. Additionally, I have continually attempted to increase our ACF CM membership during every President and Vice Presidents meeting. I could only increase 10 new members in Korea without any further outcome. The 4th ACF International Conference in Taipei occurred with the aid of Professor Chan of Taiwan. I truly wish to acknowledge and thank the efforts of Professor Chan with a big round of

Perhaps due to the lack of strong public relations, the attendants of this year's conference seem fewer compared to past years. However, it was a great achievement to accomplish this year's conference's "ACF Taipei Declaration on Sustainability". It is a well-known fact that approximately 70% of the world's supply of cement is consumed in Asia. It is unfortunate that China and India could not participate in this event. After this session, I will leave the president position. In the 4th session, I hope that the next president, Professor Ueda of Japan, can solve all the problems I could not resolve during my term as the president. I truly wish every ACF member and their families good health and well-being. Thank you.

Prof. Park reported the some amendments of Constitution and byelaws regarding the number of persons chosen for the Executive Council in item 10 (from 9 to 14).

5c. Membership status

Before the election process of the ACF Presidential board, Prof. Park reported the current status of EC members and RM members. After new EC and RM nomination request, the list of new EC and RM members are represented.

India and China are recommended as new member countries to be scouted for ACF.

5d. Update of the 4th ACF Conference

Prof. Chan reported on the preparation process results of 4th ACF Conference on November 29 ~ December 1, 2010, in Taipei International Convention Center, Taipei, Taiwan.

6. Vice President (Technical Dept.) Report

6a. TG4

Prof. Supartono did not attend the meeting but the progress was discussed. The TG4 activity was not completed yet but will be finished at the early of next year (2011).

6b. TG5

Prof. Ueda reported that JCI decided to keep continuously working on the ACMC Documentation. So that he asked to extend the TG 5 activity for one extra year till the end of 2011.

6c. TG6

Prof. Noguchi expressed some difficulties in collecting valuable and meaningful data from member countries. He mentioned that the valuable data collection should not be hurried but continuous data collection is necessary. He asked to utilize the ACF homepage to distribute the collected data. One more year extension was requested and agreed by all EC members. Prof. Sakai was asked to review the data.

6d. TG7

Prof. Choi reported the activities of TG7 on the preparation of ACF Environmental Declaration (ED). The final title of the declaration was determined as 'ACF Taipei Declaration on Sustainability.' As the ACF Taipei Declaration was just finalized at the ACF ED round table meeting held before the 6th EC meeting TG7 activity was terminated. However, ACF Environmental Forum will be run under the supervision of Prof. Sakai as a Forum Chair. Prof. Choi and Prof. Noguchi will serve as a Forum Secretary.

7. Vice President (Political Dept.) Report

Prof. Hung tried to contact China, Laos, and Cambodia for their joining to ACF but no response was returned. Also he pointed out that ACF loses some member countries such as Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, India etc. so that ACF HO may need to be more active in strengthening the member country's belonging royalty.

Prof. Park briefly reported the publication of the Newsletter in 2009 (Vol. 3 No. 1 to No. 3) and in 2010 (Vol. 4 No. 1 to No. 2). The final Newsletter in 2010 (Vol. 4 No.3) will be published as soon as possible by Prof. Kim keeps contributing the publication of Vol. 4 No. 3.
